

To use N1MM for OSPOTA, you need the following two files in addition to having an updated copy of N1MM installed on your computer.

OH-Parks.udc

OH-Parks.sec

❓ The OH-Parks files will enable you to use N1MM+ as a logger for the Ohio state Parks On The Air contest (OSPOTA). It is designed for stations operating from within an Ohio State Park. It was NOT designed for Not-In-Park stations, however you can still use it, provided you keep one rule in mind. ***If you are not operating from a state park, then the only stations you may contact for point credit are the State Park stations. If you enter a contact with a not-in-park Station, it will accept, and mistakenly give you point credit for it. In other words, If you are operating as a "not-in-park" station it will NOT keep you from working other "not-in-park" stations. So, you will need to be vigilant about that. This is not an issue If you are operating from a state park***

❓ The following paths are for my PC running Windows 10. Your directories may be in a different place depending on your version of Windows.

❓ Use State Park abbreviations, do not spell them out. You can find a list of abbreviations at [OSPOTA.org](https://ospota.org).

OH-Parks.**udc** is the User defined contest file. Place this in your “Documents/N1MM Logger+/UserDefinedContests” folder.

OH-Parks.**sec** is the current (as of August 31, 2025) list of Ohio state Park abbreviations. Place this in your “Documents/N1MM Logger+/SupportFiles” folder.

Remember, this isn't perfect. Familiarize yourself with this software before the next OSPOTA.
